



RED MEN NCAA STATISTICAL CHAMPIONS

The Red Men lacrosse team received its recognition this past week from the NCAA for their statistical championship in the 2011 season. After finishing the 2010 season 10th in the country the team set a goal of leading in 2011. That goal was accomplished, finishing the year with a man-up scoring percentage of .541. The Red Men scored on 40 of 74 opportunities finishing well ahead of Cortland (.474) and Tufts (.463). Senior attackman/midfielder, Keegan Bowman (New Westminster, BC) lead the way with 12 of those goals, followed by Danny Morse (O'Fallon, IL) with 8, and Cory Childs (Savage, MN) putting in 7. Carthage also finished the 2011 season 7th nationally in goals per game at 15.00 and ranked in the top ten in D-III in 6 other offensive categories.
